


Waves, Wetlands, and Watersheds

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Waves, Wetlands, and Watersheds is a classroom activity guide for teachers that addresses California's coastal and marine issues such as endangered species, marine debris, coastal geology, water use, and more. It is carefully aligned to the California State Science Content Standards for grades 3 through 8, includes Community Action lessons adaptable for all ages up to and beyond grade 12, and is correlated to Common Core and NGSS. The connection between inland areas and the ocean is emphasized throughout, so the lessons are relevant for students living in all regions of California.
